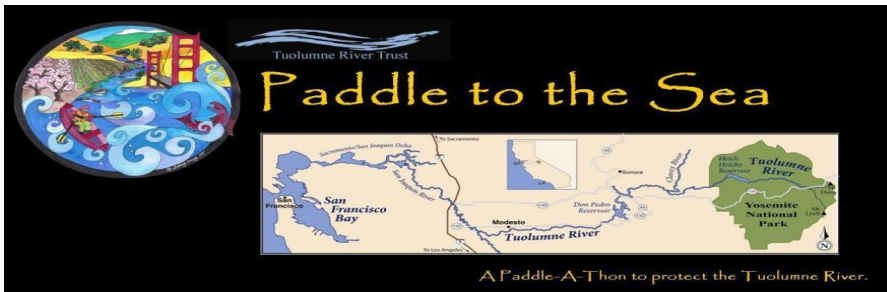

Our speakers: **Jessie Raeder** is from the Tuolumne River Trust in San Francisco and is the director of an annual event called "Paddle to the Sea" ([www.paddletothesea.org](http://www.paddletothesea.org)) on the Tuolumne and San Joaquin rivers. Jessie currently coordinates the Trust's campaign to restore the salmon of the lower Tuolumne. She also sits on the board of the SalmonAid Foundation and is active in the movement to restore wild Pacific salmon to the rivers and streams of the West Coast.

**Aaron Jones**, former member of ACYC (Columbia 26 "Margarita") and son of ACYC member Stan Jones, has participated in this event and this year is leading a "Paddle to the Sea" on the American River. He is employed by California Canoe and Kayak, which has offices in Rancho Cordova, Oakland, and Half Moon Bay. Aaron has been paddling and sailing off and on most of his life and is currently an active member of the Sacramento Sea Kayakers.
